


The Chandelle

Purpose

High performance 180° climbing turn.

Used in dogfighting, fighter formations, and to reverse course & gain altitude.



The airplane exits the maneuver 180° from entry at a higher altitude.

Procedure

- 1. Begin no lower than 1,500' AGL
- 2. Clear the area
- 3. Align wing to reference landmark
- 4. From wings-level cruise, increase to 2,000 RPM and 30" MP
- 5. Establish and maintain 30° of bank from 0°point \rightarrow 90° point in the turn
 - Constant bank
 - Continually decreasing airspeed
- 6. Begin coordinated rollout from 90° point $\rightarrow 180^{\circ}$ point
 - Constant rate of rollout
 - Constant pitch attitude
- 7. Complete rollout at 180° from entry ±10°
 - Align opposite wing to entry reference landmark
- 8. Conclude with a wings level nose high attitude above stall speed
- 9. Return to straight and level flight at cruise power [1,850 RPM & 28" MP]
 - Minimal loss of altitude
